Fulfilled Prophecy

Isaiah 42:9 - "See, the former things have taken place, and new things I declare; before they spring into being I announce them to you."



Luke 19:28–34 - After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. 29 As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 30"Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it."32 Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. 33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34 They replied, "The Lord needs it."

Matthew 21:4–5 - "This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: (then he quotes Zechariah 9:9) "Say to the Daughter of Zion, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

Zechariah 9:10 – "… He will proclaim peace to the nations. His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth."

Luke 19:35–40 - They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. 36 As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road. 37 When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: 38 "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" 39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" 40 "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

Luke 19:41–44 - As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it 42 and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. 43 The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. 44 They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

Daniel's Prophecy

Daniel 9:24 - "Seventy 'sevens' are decreed for your people and your holy city to finish transgression, to put an end to sin, to atone for wickedness, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the Most Holy Place."

Daniel's Prophecy

Daniel 9:25–26 - "Know and understand this: From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be seven 'sevens,' and sixty-two 'sevens.' It will be rebuilt with streets and a trench, but in times of trouble. 26 After the sixty-two 'sevens,' the Anointed One will be put to death, but not for himself."

Daniel's Prophecy

Daniel 9:25–26 - "Know and understand this: <u>From the time</u> <u>the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem</u> until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be seven 'sevens,' and sixty-two 'sevens.' Starting Point: March 5, 444 B.C. (Nehemiah 2:5-8)

7 sevens = 7 x 7 years = 49 years. (brings us to 395 B.C.) <u>62 sevens = 62 x 7 years = 434 years</u> 69 sevens = 69 x 7 years = 483 years. ("anointed one comes")
