

I want to start this sermon today by playing various frequencies of sound and we'll see if you hear them? It is a known fact that as we get older, our ability to hear higher frequencies of sound diminish.

So, let's start out with a frequency of **8kHz** that most of you should be able to hear. If you are older than 75 however you may have trouble hearing this. [play] Put up your hand if you heard that.

Next, we'll play **12kHz**. This will be hard for you to hear if you are older than 50. [play] Put up your hand if you heard that.

Now, we'll play **14kHz**. If you are over 40 you'll have trouble hearing this. [play] Put up your hand if you can still hear this.

Next, is **15 kHz**. If you are over 25 you'll have trouble hearing this. [play] Put up your hand if you can hear this.

Next, is **17 kHz**. This is sometimes referred to as the teenager frequency because it tends to be one that only teenagers can hear. [play] Put up your hand if you heard that?

Finally, we'll play **22kHz**. If you can hear this, you're hearing is like that of a dog [play]

Isn't it strange how certain frequencies of sound waves might be played and yet you can't hear. The reason I did that was because it is a illustration of how God is speaking to us, but sometimes we don't hear...
